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# THE LAST WHISTLE PURCHASED DURING ARTPRIZE® 2016

We weren't kidding when we said **Go Big or Go Home**, in September we headed to Michigan to compete for \$500,000 at ArtPrize8, an international art competition in Grand Rapids, Michigan.

Great news: The Last Whistle #1/5 was purchased by a foundation in Saginaw MI and was delivered to the Saginaw Art Museum's foyer until spring, when the final location, pedestal, site-work will be formalized and the sculpture installed.

With help from our Crowdrise contributors—you know who you are... The Last Whistle traveled 1600+ miles and was installed with a fork lift in the Fifth Third Bank Plaza near the corner of Lyon and Monroe in downtown Grand Rapids on September 19th. From September 21-October 9, 400,000 visitors descended upon downtown Grand Rapids, Michigan where anyone can find a voice in the conversation about "What is Art? And why it matters. Art from around the world popped up in over 170 downtown venues—museums, galleries, bars, restaurants, theaters, hotels, public parks, lobbies, buildings, walls, bridges, rivers, laundromats, and auto body shops.

ArtPrize featured 1554 artists representing 44 countries and 40 US states with a total of 1453 unique art entries. During the first round of public voting where over 340,000 votes were cast, Ken's ArtPrize entry **The Last Whistle,** a larger than life bronze figurative sculpture, placed in top 25 in the 3-D category and top 100 overall. Unfortunately we did not move on to the second round, there were 43,000 votes cast for the top 20 (five in each category) 3-D, 2-D, Installation and Time-Based. The response to The Last Whistle was far greater and more emotional than we had anticipated or imagined. From the simple nod of the head and a thumbs up, to tears while sharing memories. It was overwhelming when people extended their hand to shake Ken's to thank him, with nothing more said. The individuals who connected with The Last Whistle crossed all ethnic groups and all income levels. Our motto was "Sharing of memories keeps our history and culture alive (see picture). Through the sharing of memories one can appreciate the complexities of these individuals elevating them above the mere common or generic working class.

The legacy for the Last Whistle is simply to honor and elevate recognition for the working class who is responsible for the building of America, not just the homes and the high-rises - highways and products, but the fabric of our society. We look forward for The Last Whistle to reach its fullest potential when set publically in prominent locations, allowing viewers to share memories with family and friends of their life, or that of ancestors. The Last Whistle is an edition of 5.

There are amazing crowdfunding opportunities to cover costs of purchasing the sculpture, or just its basing and siting costs. One thing we know is that people rally around the blue collar workers, almost everyone has a connection somewhere in their past.

Casting time can vary from 4-6 months depending on the foundry's schedule. There is also a 1/2 scale sculpture of The Last Whistle available, it is an edition of 11.

A winter snowfield and Magpie led me on a journey of discovery. The observation that a magpie's white plumage disappeared on that snowfield and the confidence to experiment with this concept resulted in Mischief and Plunder.

The composition was greatly aided by the fact that the Magpies are of the corvid family possessing an intelligence that makes for

wonderful energy and movement. Gregarious, somewhat communal and playful, their posturing is the structure, but the bird's sensitive need to belong is what takes the sculpture to another level.

In describing the unique Magpie postures and the three bird's antics to a friend and art patron, the immediate response was Moe, Larry and Curly! For me, no more needed to be said, perfectly capturing the concept of Mischief and Plunder.

# SMALL WORKS FOR INTIMATE PLACEMENTS

The posture is one of my imagination, not that of observation. It is a posture that is possible and probable and shows the beauty of a hummingbird at rest; portraying a glistening jewel.

The extension which supports the hummingbird is meant to represent a geometric abstraction of the hummingbird form. Unlike the jewel representation of the hummingbird, the geometric form represents the power of man and nature. The piercing of metal through metal suggests the tension between power and beauty. As we travel the country, we have seen the aftermath of Katrina in Florida, the tornadoes in Joplin, Missouri and the storm surges of Sandy. Each bronze sculpture depicts a different theme representing the power and resilience of Mother Nature.

Edition #16/22 SOLD  $\sim$  Layers is a reflection of walking the river bottom across America. The common denominator from East to West and North to South is the rise and fall of the river level. Exposing layers of sediment and erosion, the life and history of the river and its extremes. That great natural beauty and the power of rising water, all represented in an abstract form of shadows. There are six more unique Calm After the Storm sculptures left in an edition of 22.

I chose to remember the past and its impact on women of the future, the solid oak chair was the chair of choice. I encourage Ken to just play with a concept. Opulence began as was a study on a scratch pad at a Days Inn for a larger sculpture he was contemplating several years ago at a show in Arizona.

He intently worked daily on this small 9" clay for a couple weeks, one of the artists at the show who enjoys converses with Ken while he is working, told him "that's not how I dry my hair". He initially ignored her, she was insistent and would stop by and say "I can't stand on my toes and dry my hair, it doesn't happen that way". Ken tells her "Whitney, that's not what I am sculpting." So he completes the sculpture and she stops by and tells him again, "I just can't do that Ken". He explains to her the sculpture is all about that 5 star resort towel... and then asked her to show him how she dries her hair, she bent over and hence Essential. So that's the end of the story... ~ Deb

#### A DOG FOR ALL SEASONS

If you are very lucky — a great dog may grace your life. They move beyond a companion to a true, invaluable friend and family entity, but most importantly they are a patient teacher. They provide a lifetime of memories, wonderfully seared into our hearts for a lifetime. "A Dog for all Seasons" was inspired by the stories of a client's magnificent lab. A perfect example of the physical conformation of a British male Labrador retriever and the loving and complex personality of such a great breed.

The lab mastered the many worlds of sporting, family and service. His intense focus and desire in the field was only matched by his measured and wellmannered ability to read people and his Everyone already knows of surroundings. a lab's devotion, love of family and of course the family bed. His unique ability was to excel in so many different environments, from nature to those of man's making. Great dogs seem to possess a split personality. Lab owners fondly refer to this trait as "the switch". They transform in an instant, from a calm and sweet social being, to an intense and focused hunting machine, by a simple opening of the gun cabinet.





As an artist this trait became the focus and challenge of this new sculpture. What evolved is the illusion of a dog just sitting. A calm posture, with a cock of the head he exudes the aura of a stoic and confident friend, whose kind eyes melt your soul. However, as you move around the sculpture, a sense of physical tension starts to emerge. The hind legs slightly raised — the front shoulders form a straight hard line with his foot, just over the edge. He now looks as if he awaits the unknown (sounds of incoming ducks — a pheasant in the wind—a human command). Only to us, is it the unknown — the switch is flipped.

The relief panels serve as the completion of the story of a great dog, a window to bring his personalities to life. From family to service to the field — The Lab, truly a Dog for All Reasons. A dog bred for the cold water and duck hunting, who adapted and became so much more. A dog that can shine throughout all the seasons of the year — "A Dog for All Seasons."
