CHIEF JOSEPH PROJECT

The Nez Perce is one on the tribes who navigated the lands from Oregon, Washington and Idaho. Ken's working on a special project—urged by a client to share his narrative in the Native American culture, the same one who commissioned Pure Freedom, Resilient Soul and A Land of Many Gifts. Our conversations continued and he asked me again to immerse myself in Chief Joseph, a great orator, human and leader of the

Nez Perce Tribe. If you haven't read about the Last Indian War, pick up the book.

This sculpture is a Life-1/2 bust in foam, not yet completed. The image gives you a view into my process of using ridged foam to design the body posture before applying clay and texturing the sculpture.

Always thinking about the narrative of Chief Joseph and learning more each and every day. Appreciate the opportunity to explore different cultures and express them in Sculpture.

WALKING THE WOOD

You can almost always tell then Ken is working. You can hear his hammer and chisel throughout the studio. Although he also works in clay for bronze, you can tell he is a woodsman. Ken is always busy with his hands and eyes, feeling and seeing beyond the known and revealing the unseen in the wood. He's a wood whisperer of sorts.

Trying to describe what Ken does with or to the wood is somewhat difficult. He exposes the art in the wood. He liberates the story that lies within the wood. Removing what is not necessary to reveal what's vital. Actually, describing his work is easy; realizing how much time, energy, patience, commitment and persistence he invests into each piece suggests the true meaning of the man. He's one of a kind.

With spooky intuition developed through years of experience. Ken knows what the inside grain will reveal. Of course, wood work being what it is, he is also knows how to adopt, adapt, and improve his designs as he works. After all, you realize when you see that's the secret of life, isn't it?

In October 2023 we headed to Arkansas State University (ASU) in Jonesboro to meet with the Dean of Sciences and Mathematics to view a 5'x11" round of redwood, which had traveled from Scotia, California to ASU many moons ago. The wood at one time was located at the entrance to the College's museum. The University made a recent Mascot change from the Indians to the Red Wolves (an endangered species). Conversations at the University about the use of the redwood slab and how it could be monetized. A fellow sculptor Dale Weiler recommended they contact this "redwood carver" or as Ed Trimble of Leanin' Tree would say "whittler".

The redwood round intrigued Ken, as a redwood faller in the late eighties in Fort Bragg California, redwood was one of his favorite woods when he began carving. Although, he has never carved on the end grain of a stump.

In December 2024, this 400lb+ hunk of wood was delivered to Ken's studio in Idaho. Once stabilized and mounted for carving, the process will involve ASU's students, alumni and faculty. Each responsible for sharing their narrative by researching the travels/ history of the redwood round, the connection of the Red Wolves to the Native Americans that thrived in the past. Sharing their knowledge of conservation efforts to bring these wolves back to Arkansas and other Southeastern States. All this information will be internalized by Ken and then the wood will direct the concept(s), which will be presented to ASU for approval. Ken is excited to work with ASU on this project.

After design approval and changes, the Walking of the Wood will continue and only then will the first chips FLY. As many of you know, this is not a fast process, we plan to share this journey with ASU and you our collectors, friends and family.
